## Symphony Affair Adopts 'Some Like It Hot' Theme

"Some Like It Hot" is the theme for this year's Honolulu Symphony dinner concert which will be held November 26 at 5 p.m. in the Royal Hawaiian Hotel Monarch Room.

Conductor George Barati's program for the evening will include the "Peruvian Yaravi" by Delgadillo; "The Creatures of Prometheus Overture," by

SOLOIST WILL be Jack Conner, who is considered one of the outstanding virtuosos of the marimba and vibraphone.

The announcement was made at the executive board meeting by Eleanor Kasal, Haiku, Maui. The meeting was held in the home of Mrs. Gertrude P. Harrell, State extension home economist.

The board voted that the Hilton Hawaiian Village Hotel would be the site of the convention. It is expected that husbands and possibly families of homemaker delegates will attend.

TENTATIVE PLANS for the annual Hawaii Home Demonstration Council conference were announced by Mrs. Lenore Young, conference chairman.

The conference theme is "Homemaking Around the World." Pre-convention activities will begin April 12, with the meeting ending April 15.

Plans for a homemaker's short course at the University of Hawaii in August also were announced.

Among those attending the board meeting was Mrs. Ruth Penner, president of the Home Demonstration Economists Association.
